Share the Road

I attended the Ontario Bike Summit sponsored by "Share the Road" coalition (<http://www.sharetheroad.ca/>) It was a chance to hear speakers from other cities who have made their municipalities bike friendly, and in doing so have increased their constituent's health, made their streets less congested and safer, plus drawn tourism to their area because of the ease of getting around - Mayor was Sam Adams from Portland Oregon was the major speaker promoting the Active Communities program.

Eleanor McMahon started Share the Road coalition after her husband OPP constable Greg Stoddard was killed by a dump truck while out on a training ride (read about her on the site). She is very effective in the government, being a previous aide to former Prime Minister Jean Chretien and she proved her connections at this year's summit by having many political heavy weights there including Transport

Minister Kathleen Wynne and 8 of her staff who took part in the meeting plus allowed a session where - we - as participants got to have input into what we would like to see for roads, rules, education and municipal liaisons with the province.

There are major initiatives going on right now - 3foot passing law - paved shoulders - Re-writing of the HTA with more emphasis on cycling + more. NOW is the time to get involved - join the coalition - donate - take part in Active Communities - what ever you can do will make the roads safer for us to ride on and help people from being injured or killed while riding a bicycle.

We as Randonneurs deserve to ride on safe roads however we, as Randonneurs must be an active part of this solution, by riding safely, according to the HTA and by urging our local politicians to recognize bicycles. There is a "pledge" on the site to get the candidates for municipal or provincial elections to sign.

Private Member's bill to Get Paved Shoulders on Roadway

Recently, Ontario Progressive Conservative Norm Miller introduce a private member's bill which would require a one-metre paved shoulder be added whenever designated secondary highways are being resurfaced. The bill has received second reading and has received the support of Transport Minister Kathleen Wynn.

If it went into affect, most or all of the roads we use for our routes could see one-metre paved shoulders. This would certain help to improve the comfort and safety for cyclists riding our rural roads. The province already has a pilot project underway to pave one metre of each side of Highway 6 on Manitoulin Island.

Ghost Bikes

Ghost Bikes are small and sombre memorials for bicyclists who are killed or hit on the street. A bicycle is painted all white and locked to a street sign near the crash site, accompanied by a small plaque. They serve as reminders of the tragedy that took place on an otherwise anonymous street corner, and as quiet statements in support of cyclists' right to safe travel.

The first ghost bikes were created in St. Louis, Missouri in 2003, and they have since appeared in over 100 locations throughout the world. For those who create and install the memorials, the death of a fellow bicyclist hits home. We all travel the same unsafe streets and face the same risks; it could just as easily be any one of us. Each time we say we hope to never have to do it again -- but we remain committed to making these memorials

Ghostbikes.org is intended to be a site for the worldwide cycling community. For information on ghost bike work being done in your area, go to www.ghostbikes.org and click one of the locations.

This site was initially set up by the NYC Street Memorial Project. We work hard to collect information

on many other locations, but for the most part only have access to media reports. This site reflects NYC's project very well, but much of our information on other places is incomplete. We want to encourage people everywhere to help fill in the blanks on this site and help it grow.

We hope to create a space where those lost on dangerous streets can be remembered by their loved ones, members of their local communities, and others from around the world. We also hope to inspire more people to start installing ghost bikes in their communities and to initiate changes that will make us all safer on the streets.

Award Nominations

Its time to recognise those members who have made an outstanding contribution to the club or who have had an outstanding Randonneuring season in 2010. To nominate someone for an award, send an email to Isabelle at president@randonneursontario.ca, with the name of your nominee(s) and which award you think they should receive.



Awards will be announced at the Awards Dinner in February 2011.

Awards:

Jock Wadley Award (Outstanding Rider): Awarded to a club rider who is outstanding in one year or over several years.

Beryl Burton Award (Best Female Rider): Awarded to a club rider who is outstanding in one year or over several years, and has shown interest in the club and has provided support and assistance and helped on rides or helped other riders.

Dan Herbert Award: Awarded to a member who has in one or more years benefited the club by mentoring one or more members (generally but not necessarily new). Mentoring is to be defined as encouraging, educating and assisting riders to achieve their full potential as bike riders and Club members.

Coronation Cup (Most Improved Rider): Awarded to a club rider who has at least one previous year riding with the Randonneurs Ontario, and has shown consistency in appearing and in cycling, demonstrated improvement either in cumulative mileage ridden from previous season, or in brevet finishing times over the previous season.

Rookie of the Year: Awarded to a club rider who has joined the Randonneurs Ontario in the year of the award or who rode their first brevet in the year of the award, shown ability in the year and shown interest in the club and in other club riders.

Half Wheel Award: Awarded to a club rider, who has consistently forced the pace of the group during brevet rides.

Best Fleche Team : Awarded to the members of the team who record the most kilometers on the Fleche Ontario event in the year of the award.

Long Distance Award: Awarded to the rider who has completed the highest number of Kilometres during the past season on ACP sanctioned events. This would include, for example, Brevets and Raids at any recognized Randonneur club throughout the world. This does not include, for example populaires and non-sanctioned events.

Organiser of the Year: Awarded to that person who has provided support to the club's riding events in the year of the award or over several years, demonstrated care for the well being of the club's riders and consistently taken on the task of organising and supporting club rides.

Outstanding Performance on a Brevet: Awarded to the club rider who has demonstrated significant fortitude, courage, or generosity on a brevet ride; demonstrated physical or mental abilities beyond the usual in the conduct of a brevet ride.

Tom Parry Award: Awarded to club riders who have completed Paris-Brest-Paris on two or more occasions.

Special Recognition Award : Awarded to a club rider who has completed a cycling event in the year of the award that merits commemoration.

President's Address

The President thanked the members present for attending 27th annual meeting and stated that she would be retiring next year. She also stated that she was pleased with the turn out at the meeting.

Treasurer's report

Jim Griffin, presented the Financial report for the year 2010. He stated that as the year-end is Sept 30, hence the one presented here is interim - there are a few outstanding items but these are minimal.

There was a significant increase in membership in 2010 (117),, which accounts for a profit of \$678.62 for the fiscal year. Increased expenses are because of insurance and OCA – all expenses are in line - meeting and AGM costs, plus devils week costs have increased, plus the club paid for Real Prefontaine's attendance at the awards dinner.

The bank Balance as of September 18, 2010 remains at a comfortable amount of \$11,750.00

Jim Griffin presented a budget 2011. The total income is forecast at \$8,250.00 and expenditures at \$7,560.00 with a projected surplus of \$ 690.00.

Moved by Jim Griffin / Seconded by Peter Leiss that the Financial Report for the year 2010 be approved. CARRIED.

Membership fees for 2010.

Isabelle Sheardon recommended that the membership fees for 2010 remain at \$50.00 per individual and \$75.00 per family. Day ride fee is \$20 for first ride and second ride is \$30
